





Attendance Counts!

Wow! Thanks for a great Book Fair! Now that you have some books in your home library. I have some fun facts about why reading at home for fun is so important. Make reading time something to look forward to and picture books are fun for kids of all ages. Picture books build **comprehension.** Talk about the pictures and what happens in the story and how they feel about the characters and events. Picture book develop story sense-beginning, middle and end. Picture books are a tool for teaching cause and affect. Look for words such as because, so, if, then, as a result of, etc. Picture books are multi-sensory. They hear the story, see the pictures, touch the pages, and smell the book. Repetition: Young children get excited when they can tell you what comes next. So keep reading; it's good for you and your kids.
